The main reasons for the appearance of slang in the language are the desire to separate oneself from the adult world, the desire to "encrypt" one's language, attempts to shorten words for easier communication in chats, and simply desire to be aroused. respectable person's mirror surface from English.

There are several ways to form slang phrases:

1. Release.

Derivation or word formation is the formation of new words from the same root. The derivation in English youth slang is expressed by the same educational methods as in the literary language.

For example: stupidity - stupidity, stupidity; I'm mad - I'm done.

. rhyming slang.

Rhyming slang originated among London workers and consists of replacing simple words with phrases that rhyme with the replaced words.

For example: bread = head; Adam and Eve = believe; you and me = tea.

1. foreign debts.

Foreign words are widely used in English youth slang. For example: adios (from Spanish) - goodbye, see you; avatar (from Sansk. "descend, incarnate, appear, appear") - a small image representing a certain person (user). Virtual reality (forums, blogs, ICQ, etc.).

1. Ambiguity.

Ambiguity is the presence of two or more meanings in a word that are interconnected in terms of meaning and origin.

For example: sand - sugar, sand; wood - wood, grove; OK - well, everything is fine, don't worry.

1. initial abbreviations.

Initial abbreviations or acronyms in English youth slang are usually written with or without a period after the initials.

For example: B. F. - best friend; O.M.G. - oh my God; BTW - by the way.

1. Univerbization (abbreviation).

For example: Burger from Hamburger; motor hotel to motel; smoke from smoke; university - university.

1. Tmesis.

Tmesis is a linguistic phenomenon in which a word is divided into two distant parts and other words are inserted between them.

For example: abso-bloody-lutely, inde-loddamn-pendent; beauty is bloody.

1. you were crossed (apocopus).

For example: zam = exam; pre sci = preliminary science examination; soph = sophomore; ret = tobacco cigarette.

1. Metaphor (portable meaning).

For example: living in a birdcage (birdcage) - living in a student dormitory.

- 1. Metonymy (the word is replaced by another, related concept).
- 1. Substitution with a fist.

For example: Bastard - basket.

1. Antonomasia (what is the replacement of a name or a name by indicating some important feature of the object or its relationship).

Example of antonomasia: Baltic - very windy weather.

1. metathesis (interchange of sounds or syllables).

Example of metathesis: Broprofessional = brother professional - real brother.

1. Addition of roots.

Example of adding roots: Eduhater = who hates education - a teacher who hates his job.

1. Telescope (two compound or more words).

Telescopic example: Bri-utiful = Brianna is beautiful

Nowadays, English slang is used in many areas of society by different people. Slang is most popular among teenagers and young adults, but that doesn't mean others don't use it at all. Slang exists in politics, art, and the world of crime. Everyone uses it in their speech at will, someone replaces simple words with vulgar expressions, others replace them with more intelligent words, for someone the replacement is related to their profession.
